

**Q. What should a district/BOCES do if they do not have a 20-20-60 point distribution methodology included in their approved APPR plan?**

At its June 2013 meeting the Board of Regents approved the use of an “enhanced” growth model for the 2012-13 and 2013-14 school years, and the use of a Value-added model beginning in the 2014-15 school year, for teachers in grades 4-8 ELA and Math and their building principals and high school principals of buildings with grades 9-12 (see: <http://www.regents.nysed.gov/meetings/2013Meetings/June2013/613p12hea1.pdf>).

For the 2012-13 and 2013-14 school year, districts and BOCES are required to assign 0-20 points to all teachers and principals for both the State Growth and the Locally-selected Measures subcomponents.

Those districts and BOCES that **did not** previously negotiate a 20-20-60 point distribution methodology for Tasks 3.1, 3.2, and 8.1 in their currently approved APPR submission, may either submit a material change to include these charts by sending an email to [educatoreval@mail.nysed.gov](mailto:educatoreval@mail.nysed.gov) (please include "20 Point Local" in the subject line) or the district or BOCES must implement a 20 point chart for the locally-selected measures subcomponent by multiplying each point on its 15 point chart by a factor of 4/3 (1.33). This methodology converts the agreed upon allocation to the 20 point chart required by law.

Districts and BOCES that **did** negotiate both a 0-15 point and a 0-20 point distribution methodology for Tasks 3.1, 3.2, and 8.1, but only included a 25-15-60 point distribution in their currently approved APPR submission to the Department, should now submit the negotiated 20-20-60 point distribution chart by sending an email to [educatoreval@mail.nysed.gov](mailto:educatoreval@mail.nysed.gov) (please include “20 Point Local” in the subject line).
