<p><b>I. CONTENT AND ANALYSIS</b></p> <p><i>An EBC is a clearly stated inference that arises from close reading of a text.</i></p>	<p><b>Clarity of the Claim:</b></p> <p>States an idea you have inferred directly from a text and that you want others to consider.</p>	
	<p><b>Conformity to the Text:</b></p> <p>Is directly based upon – and may comment on – the ideas, details, language, and form of a text.</p>	
	<p><b>Understanding of the Topic:</b></p> <p>Demonstrates knowledge of and sound thinking about a text or topic that matters to you and others.</p>	
<p><b>II. COMMAND OF EVIDENCE</b></p> <p><i>An EBC is supported by specific textual evidence and developed through valid reasoning.</i></p>	<p><b>Reasoning:</b></p> <p>Represents sound thinking supported by relevant and sufficient evidence drawn directly from the text.</p>	
	<p><b>Use and Integration of Evidence:</b></p> <p>Presents and integrates supporting quotations and textual references in a logical sequence that explains and discusses the claim.</p>
